

How to Make a Child Support Payment

Cash Payments: Cash payments can be made at the county clerk's office where the support order was issued. Cash payments can also be made at thousands of U.S. MoneyGram locations including Walmart and CVS. Find locations at www.MoneyGram.com/locations and use Receive Code 14658.

Mail-In Payments: Money orders and personal checks (NO CASH) can be sent to the following address:

Be sure to include the case number, your name, and the name of the other parent.

Online Payments: Payment can be made online using a credit card, subject to a non-refundable convenience fee of 2.25%. Online payments can be made at the following address:

Payments by Telephone: Call (855) 972-9427. Press 1 to talk to a live operator and then press 2 to make the child support payment. You will need to inform the operator that you want to make an Indiana child support payment. You will also need to provide your social security number, 10-digit Indiana child support case number, payment amount, credit card information, and telephone number.

What is the Title IV-D Child Support Program?

Title IV-D of the Federal Social Security Act requires states to provide child support services. In Indiana, the Title IV-D Child Support Program is administered by the Department of Child Services (DCS) and the Child Support Bureau (CSB). Title IV-D is carried out locally by the county prosecutor's office, the office of the county clerk, and the courts.

Who is eligible for Title IV-D Services?

Custodial parents, non-custodial parents, and legal guardians can apply for child support services regardless of their income level.

Why Should I Join the Title IV-D Program?

The program will help you meet the medical and financial needs of your children.

What Services are NOT Provided?

- Program caseworkers and attorneys DO NOT represent you as an attorney.
- Parenting time and custody arrangements ARE NOT addressed by this program
- Deviation from state child support guidelines is prohibited unless ordered by the court.

Frequently Asked Child Support Questions...

What Services Can Be Provided?

The Child Support program provides parents and legal guardians with assistance in obtaining financial support and medical insurance coverage for their children by...

- Establishing paternity
- Performing genetic (DNA) testing in paternity actions
- Establishing child support orders
- Establishing medical support orders
- When appropriate, under federal and state law, filing a petition to modify a child support order upon the request of the custodial or non-custodial party (*all required financial information must be provided*)
- Locating parents
- Enforcing child support orders (*can include license suspension, contempt of court proceedings, federal and state tax intercepts, and vehicle liens*)
- Processing child support payments and monitoring cases for compliance
- Assisting other states to establish and enforce child support orders when a parent resides outside of Indiana
- Provide referrals to other agencies and organizations that provide employment and legal assistance

How Can I Apply For Services?

The Prosecutor's Office can provide the Title IV-D services to parents and legal guardians regardless of income level...

TANF Recipients: If you are receiving TANF benefits, your case has already been referred to the Prosecutor's Office for Title IV-D services.

MEDICAID Recipients: If your child is receiving Medicaid, you are entitled to receive Title IV-D services free of charge. You will need to complete an application for services.

All others: If you are not receiving TANF or Medicaid benefits, you may apply for Title IV-D services by paying a one-time fee of \$25.00.

Applications for services may be picked up at the Child Support Division of the Prosecutor's Office located at 321 Main Street, Suite C in Rockport. Applications are also available online at:
